

THE ART INSTITUTE OF CHICAGO was incorporated May 24, 1879, for the "founding and maintenance of schools of art and design, the formation and exhibition of collections of objects of art, and the cultivation and extension of the arts of design by any appropriate means." The museum building upon the lake front, first occupied in 1893, is open to the public every week day from 9 to 5:30, Sundays from 12:15 to 9 p. m. Admission is free to members and their families at all times, and free to all upon Wednesdays, Saturdays, Sundays, and public holidays.

The Art School, in the same building, includes departments of Drawing, Painting, Sculpture, Decorative Designing and its allied branches, Normal Instruction, and Architecture.

All those interested in the Art Institute are invited to become members. Annual Members pay a fee of Ten Dollars a year, or upon payment of One Hundred Dollars become Life Members and are thenceforth exempt from dues. All receipts from Life memberships are invested and the income only expended.

During the past year the Trustees have established the Sustaining Membership. This will afford an opportunity to those who wish to make an annual subscription larger than the Annual Membership. Sustaining Members may pay any amount in excess of Twenty-five Dollars a year. All friends are urged to join this class of members so as to furnish the additional money which must be obtained to maintain the Museum.

Governing Members are elected by the Trustees and are limited to two hundred. Upon the payment of Four Hundred Dollars, in addition to their initiation fee of One Hundred Dollars, Governing Members become Governing Life Members and are thenceforth exempt from dues.

All members are entitled, with their families and visiting friends, to admission to exhibitions, receptions, lectures, and entertainments given by the Art Institute (excepting the Sunday concerts), and to the use of the Ryerson Library.

Visitors desiring to see the collections of the museum under guidance may make appointments with the museum instructors in Gallery 16.

THIRTY-NINTH ANNUAL REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES

Chicago, January 1, 1918

To the Governing Members of the Art Institute of Chicago:

The Trustees are pleased to report that the year 1917 has been one of comparative prosperity for the Art Institute. The great war in Europe seemed to have no effect on the work of the Art Institute until last April. Since then the abnormal conditions of life in a country at war have caused a series of complications affecting the normal conduct of the Museum and the School. Two of the trustees, 8 of the employees, and 140 of the pupils of the School have gone into the service of the United States Government.

There has been a general increase in expenses, both in the Museum and the School, and a marked decrease in our receipts from tuitions, gifts, and from Annual Members. The decrease in receipts and the increase in expenses have necessitated a greater economy in administration; but the Trustees earnestly hope that sufficient funds will be received during the coming year so that it will not be necessary to impair the usefulness of the Art Institute by curtailing any of its usual activities.

During the year 1917 two of the Trustees died: Mr. R. Hall McCormick, on March 23, and Mr. John C. Black, on June 1. Mr. George E. Adams, a former Trustee and Vice-President, died on October 11. Resolutions on the death of each of these were passed by the Trustees and are printed on pages 22 and 23.

ATTENDANCE—The number of visitors for the year was 851,336, which was 70,972 less than in the previous year. If the students were counted once for each day's attendance, it would increase the number of visitors 136,562, making the total number 987,898, or nearly a million. The decrease in attendance was doubtless due largely to the diversion of interest caused by war work.

OPERATING RECEIPTS AND EXPENSES—The cost of maintaining the Art Institute museum was greatly increased during 1916 by the addition of the new East Wing. During 1917 the expenses were still greater on account of the necessary increases in salaries, extra help, and the higher cost of coal and other supplies. The total expenses for maintaining the Museum for 1917 amounted to \$226,512.27. The receipts from the South Park tax, members' dues, door fees, catalogue sales, and income on endowment funds applicable to operating expenses amounted to \$213,182.00. This left a deficit of \$13,330.27.

The total receipts applicable to maintaining the School amounted to \$77,217.24 and the expenses to \$95,340.48, causing a deficit of \$18,123.24. The total deficit for maintaining the Museum and School was \$31,453.51. This deficit was met by an appropriation of \$5,000 from the income of unrestricted invested funds and by money borrowed from the banks. It is apparent that endowment funds are needed, the income

of which can be expended for operating expenses of Museum and School, as well as for the purchase of objects of art.

BENEFACTORS—Four of the good friends of the Art Institute have been named Benefactors, for their very liberal gifts: Mr. and Mrs. Bryan Lathrop, Mr. William Owen Goodman and Mrs. Erna Sawyer Goodman.

MEMBERS—There has been a satisfactory growth in number in all classes of membership excepting the annual membership, which has been seriously depleted. A detailed report on membership will be found on page 59 of this Report. The number of GOVERNING MEMBERS, limited by the By-Laws to 200, was 171 last January. In 1917 two resigned, four were removed by death, and 35 new Governing Members were elected, making the membership total 200 on December 31, 1917. The number of GOVERNING LIFE MEMBERS was increased this year from 56 to 71.

In March the Trustees created a new class of members to be known as SUSTAINING MEMBERS, comprised of those who are sufficiently interested in the Art Institute to contribute \$25 or more annually towards its maintenance. On December 31 there were 142 Sustaining Members who had paid \$12,345.

The LIFE MEMBERS, a year ago, numbered 2,044. During the year 232 new members were secured, and 26 were transferred to Governing Life Membership, making the number of Life Members 2,250 on December 31.

The ANNUAL MEMBERSHIP, since its establishment in 1881, had shown a steady growth—reaching the number 5,491 last March—until the outbreak of our war, when memberships began to be cancelled. There has been a loss of 1,988 Annual Members in 1917. This means a reduction in receipts of about \$20,000 a year, which is a severe loss coming, as it does, at a time when the Art Institute is in urgent need of funds. But, since 992 new members were secured, the net loss for the year was decreased to 996. Two hundred of those who discontinued their annual memberships became Life Members, and three became Governing Members. The year's receipts from all memberships amounted to \$96,804.44, an increase over 1916 of \$651.84.

BEQUESTS—Albert A. Newman, an Annual Member of the Art Institute for several years, died on November 17, 1917. He left a bequest by which the Art Institute as residuary legatee, will come into future possession of the greater part of his estate.

Mrs. Carrie F. Loewenthal, the widow of Julius W. Loewenthal, a Life Member who died May 28, 1915, has recently presented \$5,000 to the Art Institute, in memory of her husband. The interest of this sum will be used, according to the terms of the gift, as the Trustees of the Art Institute may designate.

GIFTS—Mr. William Owen Goodman and Mrs. Erna Sawyer Goodman have presented \$50,000 to the Trustees of the Art Institute, for the purpose of

establishing in perpetuity a fund to be called The Goodman Fund. The income from it is to be used for additions to the collection of the Friends of American Art.

From Mr. Wallace L. DeWolf has been received a gift of \$50,000, for the establishment of a room of American paintings to be known as the "DeWolf Gallery of American Landscapes. Gift of Wallace L. and Mary Rea DeWolf."

The Art Institute has received from Mrs. Bryan Lathrop \$20,000 for establishing and maintaining a scholarship in the School, to be known as the "Bryan Lathrop Scholarship Fund." The income only is to be used by the Trustees to give some worthy student the benefit of travel abroad or in the United States. Mrs. Lathrop has also given the larger part of the Bryan Lathrop collection of etchings and lithographs by Whistler, in which she had a life interest.

Mr. Edward B. Butler has added \$3,610 to the Butler Students' Aid Fund, which he established several years ago. This fund is to be lent as temporary aid to ambitious students who are in need.

The Atlan Ceramic Club Fund was increased in January, 1917, by a gift to the Art Institute of \$500 from the Atlan Ceramic Art Club, to be added to the \$1,000 already given (in 1912). The income from this fund is to be used for the purchase of ceramics for the Museum collection.

From The Art Students' League has been received \$500 to increase the John H. Vanderpoel Scholarship in the School to \$1,500; from the Tuesday Art and Travel Club, \$500, and from the Arché Club, \$100 for scholarships in the School; from Mr. William Randolph Hearst, \$300, for prizes in the Chicago Artists' exhibition; from the Chicago Chapter of the Society of Western Artists, \$150 to the School, as the beginning of a fund for a dormitory; and a number of friends have presented money for prizes in exhibitions, varying in amount from \$50 to \$200.

Mrs. Sarah E. Raymond Fitzwilliam, a Life Member, has presented to the Art Institute part of her valuable collection, which is the result of many years of study and travel. Her gift comprises 128 art objects for the general collection of the Museum and the following for the Ryerson Library: about 520 books, 524 photographs, 5,262 picture post cards, 1,386 lantern slides, about 100 pamphlets and guidebooks, and over 70 lectures.

In addition to the gifts of paintings from the Friends of American Art, there have been received two paintings by Ribera, "Heraclitus" and "Democritus," from the heirs of Samuel Gans; "Elaine," painting by Toby S. Rosenthal, from Mrs. Maurice Rosenfeld; and a miniature of General Joffre, by Brenda Francklyn, from friends of the Art Institute.

FRIENDS OF AMERICAN ART—This Society, which is now in the seventh year of its existence, has been a most bountiful contributor to the Museum collections. Through its generosity, the Art Institute, which began with a very inadequate representation of American paintings, has assembled a collection which is both representative and good. The addition of 11 paintings in 1917 has brought the number up to 81. There are 6 pieces of sculpture and 36 prints in the collection. In the past seven years the members have contributed \$191,068.58 to the fund of the Society.

B. F. FERGUSON MONUMENT FUND—The Trustees of the Art Institute, who are also trustees of the B. F. Ferguson Monument Fund, are actively administering the fund.

Three monuments which are now in process of construction will be completed early in 1918. The monument to commemorate the one hundredth anniversary of the admission of the State of Illinois to the Union will be placed in Logan Square. It is designed by Henry Bacon, architect, with sculptural work by Evelyn B. Longman. The foundation for this monument and the granite steps are completed, and the granite base and shaft will be completed and erected early in the spring. The monument will be dedicated at some convenient time during the summer, or, at the latest, on December 3, 1918, the anniversary of the day Illinois

was admitted to the Union. A bronze statue of Alexander Hamilton, by Bela L. Pratt, is completed and is on exhibition in Blackstone Hall. This memorial statue will be placed on a granite foundation to be built in Grant Park, north of the Art Institute. The third monument, which is well under way, is a bronze reproduction of the Statue of the Republic, designed by Daniel Chester French for the Court of Honor at the World's Columbian Exposition. The foundation of granite, designed by Henry Bacon, is already in place in Jackson Park, on the site of the Administration Building of the World's Fair. The bronze figure will be completed and placed on the foundation by April or May. This monument will be paid for by the remaining funds of the World's Columbian Exposition.

Mr. Taft is now completing the work on the full-size model of his "Fountain of Time." The Trustees are also working out plans for two new monuments: one, a memorial to Theodore Thomas, to be placed in Grant Park, south of the Art Institute, and the other a statue of Jacques Marquette, the explorer and missionary, to be erected at 24th Street and Marshall Boulevard.

Up to December 31, the Trustees of the Art Institute had received \$336,607.01 from the Northern Trust Co., the trustee of the Ferguson Fund, and had paid out on account of monuments \$146,791.09.

We look forward with confidence to the time when the Art Institute will be free from debt and when both the Museum and the School will be liberally endowed.

Resolutions on the death of R. Hall McCormick:

At a meeting of the Trustees of the Art Institute, held upon the twenty-third day of March, Nineteen Hundred and Seventeen, the Trustees were called upon to record, with sorrow, the death on the fourteenth of March of Robert Hall McCormick, who has been a Governing member of the Art Institute since Eighteen Hundred and Seventy-seven and one of its Board of Trustees since June, Eighteen Hundred and Ninety-five. He was a lover and patron of Art, and deeply interested in everything pertaining to the work of the Art Institute. The Trustees acknowledge with gratitude his service to the Institute and bid him a final farewell with sincere sorrow and regret.

Resolutions on the death of John C. Black:

The members of the Board of Trustees of the Art Institute of Chicago are moved by the death on June 1, 1917, of Mr. John C. Black to adopt and spread upon these minutes the following memorial.

Mr. Black was for thirty-eight years a Governing Member and for thirty-two years a Trustee of the Institute. A man of culture and refinement, the work of the Institute appealed especially to his interest and generosity, and he was always faithful to the duties of his trusteeship. His personal relations to his fellow members of the Board were always so friendly and so cordial that we now have to mourn not only the loss of his valued coöperation in our work, but also the severance of an intimate association which we valued most highly.

Resolutions on the death of George E. Adams:

"We have to record the passing of another distinguished member of the Art Institute, who, because of character and attainment, was honored by his city, his state and the nation. George Everett Adams was a sturdy New Englander by

birth and a product of Harvard by education. He lived his mature life in the West, and for more than thirty-seven years was a Governing Member of the Institute. During eleven years he served as Trustee, and at one time held the office of Vice-President. Wise in counsel, dignified and courteous in bearing, cultured in thought and conversation, Mr. Adams proved himself a worthy representative of the Arts by his devotion to the Institute, the Newberry Library and the Chicago Symphony Orchestra.

"We here offer our tribute of respect and affection to a life, the memory of which is eminently worthy to be treasured."

THIRTY-NINTH ANNUAL REPORT OF THE DIRECTOR

Chicago, January 1, 1918

To the Trustees of The Art Institute of Chicago:

The war has given the year 1917 a character of its own, but at the Art Institute there have been compensations for the trying problems which it has brought. The year will be remembered for the visit to the Institute of Field Marshall Joffre and former Premier Viviani and for visits of other distinguished emissaries from the nations with which ours is associated. Restraint in the activities of the Institute has been a necessity, but this has extended in certain directions only. In war work there have been more opportunities than could be met, and the problem has been to seize those which seemed to lie nearest to the characteristic and proper function of the art museum and school and to render to the public first of all, for the broadening and deepening of national enthusiasm, those types of service which institutions of a different character could not offer.

Within the Institute the activity has been at least as great as ever before. More than two-thirds of the present first floor has been completely rearranged during the year, and the decorative arts section has been more than doubled in extent. While the number of special one-man exhibitions has been greatly reduced, six exhibitions of war posters, four of works gathered by the Caxton Club, a large display of ship models and other objects lent by the United States Navy Depart-

ment, and a number of significant and interesting groups of works in the applied arts bring the total number of exhibitions within the Institute up to sixty. By an arrangement with the Board of Education and the Public School Art Society, the Art Institute has delivered, placed, and removed ten exhibitions of paintings in the public schools and in the field-houses of the small parks, making a round total of seventy exhibitions handled by the Art Institute forces during the year.

In addition to this, an unusual amount of permanent and fundamental work has been done in all departments during 1917. The general catalogue of the collections of architecture, sculpture, paintings, and drawings has been reissued with extensive revisions, entailing the renumbering of 504 objects and much other work of verification and correction. All the paintings in the permanent collections and several hundred other objects have been photographed for the records, this being part of a project designed gradually to embrace all objects in the museum. In the Ryerson Library it has been found possible to begin cataloguing the collection of Braun autotypes and thus greatly increase their usefulness, and to bring almost to completion the cataloguing of the lantern slide collection. Of special interest in the Photograph Department of the Library is the gift of the French Government, secured through Thomas E. Tallmadge, of about 100 official photographs of the devastated region of northern France. In the department of Decorative Arts the provisional installation in Gunsaulus Hall has been

preceded by the cataloguing of the greater part of the 4,500 pieces there placed. This has been done in such a manner as to admit of infinite expansion in any direction and will be basic for any future work with these objects. This project has involved a great expenditure of labor, since the greater part of the collections had never before been catalogued, while the remainder, owing to recent accessions of a character not originally provided for, called for complete revision and renumbering. The catalogue of the Blanxius Collection of 1284 pieces of old English porcelain is now ready for publication; the published handbook of the Frank W. Gunsaulus Collection of Old Wedgwood has been revised so as to afford a description of each object, in place of the group descriptions which appear in the present handbook. In the Getty Collection of Musical Instruments, in addition to cataloguing and photographing, all the objects have been subjected to a minute inspection, cleaned with great care, treated with oil to prevent cracking, repaired where this was necessary for the preservation of the objects, and restrung, missing parts being replaced where this seemed advisable. The cases for this collection have been rebuilt, lined, and painted, and a new arrangement of the objects worked out to meet the conditions of the new installation.

Two volumes of the Scammon Lectures have been published: "Six Lectures on Architecture" (the Scammon Lectures of 1915) by Ralph Adams Cram, Thomas Hastings, and Claude Bragdon, and "Engravers and Etchers" (the Scammon Lectures of 1916)

by FitzRoy Carrington. Three hundred and seventy-six lantern slides of illustrations used in these lectures were purchased for the collection in the Library. The catalogue of the Charles L. Freer loan collection of 65 Chinese paintings and other art objects, prepared by Frederick W. Gookin, Curator of the Buckingham collections in the Art Institute, and the catalogue of the Bryan Lathrop collection of etchings, drypoints, and lithographs by Whistler, prepared by Kathryn McGovern, Assistant in Charge of Prints, were among the important publications of the year.

Additions have been made to the series of Art Institute color reproductions, the most notable of these being the print of Rembrandt's "Portrait of a Young Girl." A constructive educational policy has been adopted with regard to both the color reproductions and the postcards. In pursuance of this, thirty new subjects have been added to the postcards.

New steel cases have been provided during the year for all but the larger mounts in the print collections. The adoption of these cases has necessitated a rearrangement of practically the whole of the print collection, the prints now being filed according to country and century. A number of print exhibitions of interest have been held, one of the most noteworthy of these being the Bryan Lathrop Collection of etchings, drypoints, and lithographs by Whistler, which is ultimately to pass into the possession of the Art Institute. To date, the Institute has received from Mrs. Lathrop 244 of the etchings and lithographs. These have been

unmounted, and after their mounts were cut to the standard size, remounted, accessioned, and card-indexed.

In the Thirtieth Annual Exhibition of American Oil Paintings and Sculpture, there were shown 256 works in the arts named. In this exhibition was employed for the first time the plan of distinguishing the invited from the jury pictures. The number of the former was restricted to 50, and the effect of this restriction was wholesome. A great variety of comment has been made upon this policy by the artists; but the plan seems on the whole to meet with approval, and, with slight changes, the present code of regulations for the "Annual Oil" Exhibition will probably be found useful for some years to come.

Among the important exhibitions of paintings and sculpture which were arranged during the year may be mentioned that of French art from 1870 to 1910, consisting of 170 works from the galleries of the Luxembourg; that of paintings (42) by Ignacio Zuloaga; that of works from the collection of the late R. Hall McCormick, and that of paintings and decorations by the late Howard G. Cushing.

What was perhaps one of the most important art events in the history of the Institute was the exhibition of Chinese paintings and other art objects from the collections of Mr. Charles L. Freer, of Detroit. Not only for Chicago was this a notable event, but it has been referred to as the most important public exhibition of Chinese art ever held in any country. During its stay on the walls of the Institute it brought to the

city a considerable number of distinguished Orientalists and other scholars.

The entire north half of the first floor of the Art Institute has been rearranged so that a chronological development is afforded, the Antiquarian collections by this readjustment being brought into the north range of galleries, the group of rooms best adapted to the care of these rare and beautiful objects. The new arrangement has also made it possible to set aside in a convenient place a large room to be devoted to museum instruction and the work with children. One of the most conspicuous changes in installation has been the removal of the casts of the Medici tombs from the entrance hall to a new position in Room 50 and the arranging of certain casts from ancient and modern works in bronze in the places made vacant. A new installation has been provided for on the ground floor by the removal of the ten large sculpture groups and the rearrangement of the screen partitions in this room.

An unusual amount of work has been accomplished within the Museum in connection not alone with the great number of passing exhibitions, but with the permanent collections. This has been made necessary by the moving and the recording and cataloguing already referred to, as well as by the other activities designed to make for the preservation and greater usefulness of the objects in the collections. The objects in the permanent collections which were moved and rearranged during the year numbered, in the decorative arts, 8434 articles; in painting and sculpture, 433

works. Objects shown in special exhibitions, and hence requiring double handling and double risk, numbered, in the decorative arts, 2970 articles; in painting and sculpture, 5501 works. The total number of objects therefore was 17,338; their total value estimated from insurance and other valuations, \$3,680,368.00. If all objects handled twice are counted twice, the total number is 25,809 and the total estimated value \$7,036,-896.00. All these objects have been removed, cleaned, and replaced, or received, installed, exhibited, repacked, and shipped by a gallery force of seven men, and there is no report of loss or breakage for the year.

The Art Institute extension served 41 cities and towns; exhibitions to the number of 58 were held, lectures given totaled 237. There is now in preparation for 1918-1919 a program featuring interior decoration and house-furnishing. The unanimously enthusiastic response of the most distinguished painters in the country to the Art Institute's invitation to coöperate in the extension work has been particularly gratifying.

Owing to the expansion brought about by the opening of Gunsaulus Hall, both accommodation for the objects and the labor required for handling them have become a serious problem. The need of new cases has come at a time when materials are costly and poor and when retrenchment is necessary. For this reason a temporary installation has been worked out as rapidly as possible, but always under the difficulty of adapting old cases to purposes for which they were not designed. It has often been only through an adroit manipulation

of the objects in the existing collections that they have all been kept on view. There still remains a considerable portion of the collections of decorative arts ready for installation for which even suitable temporary cases are not available at the present time. Such cases are, however, being provided, and as soon as these objects are placed on view, the remaining section of Gunsaulus Hall will be thrown open.

Despite war conditions, the loss in attendance has amounted to only 14 per cent. In the Museum Instruction Department there has been an actual increase in the work, the additional numbers of new individual students compensating for the loss in work with organizations. The inference is, of course, that the machinery provided by existing clubs and societies is being directed now to the accomplishment of war work, while the individual visitor to the museum is more than ever aware of the need of esthetic reaction. In the Library there has been a loss of two per cent in attendance, but an increase in the use of books of 10 and 13 per cent within the building and in circulation, respectively. The School has lost approximately 28 per cent from last year's attendance. One hundred and fifty members of the Art Institute community are now actually in the nation's service, most of these being students. Other students and workers have left to take part in war industries or have been drawn into other industries because of the war.

The problems of the immediate future in the Institute will center about the retention of the present

experienced working force with the remuneration which can be offered. The present spirit in the institution is excellent, all departments cheerfully doing increased work with depleted forces; but increased living costs seem destined to bring the problem of compensation to an acute stage if the war continues much longer.

MEMBERSHIP

BENEFACTORS AND MEMBERS

BENEFACTORS: Whenever any person shall have contributed twenty-five thousand dollars or more, or its equivalent, to The Art Institute of Chicago, he shall be named a Benefactor of the Art Institute, and his name shall be printed in each Annual Report under the head of Benefactors of the Art Institute, and also be placed on the Benefactors' tablet in the main hall.

HONORARY MEMBERS: Honorary Members are chosen from among persons who have rendered eminent service to the institution or who have claim to the rank of artists or patrons of art.

GOVERNING MEMBERS: The property, management, and control of the Art Institute are vested in the Governing Members. Each Governing Member pays one hundred dollars upon election and annual dues of twenty-five dollars.

Governing Members, upon payment of four hundred dollars, are exempt from dues and are known as Governing Life Members. The receipts from these funds are invested, and the income only expended.

SUSTAINING MEMBERS: Sustaining Members shall be those who contribute twenty-five dollars or more annually to the Art Institute. They shall be entitled to all the privileges of Governing Members, excepting the right to vote for, or to be eligible to, the office of Trustee.

THE ART INSTITUTE OF CHICAGO

LIFE MEMBERS: Life Members, upon the payment of one hundred dollars, have all the privileges of Annual Members for life. All receipts from these memberships are invested, and the income only expended.

ANNUAL MEMBERS: Annual Members pay ten dollars a year.

All members are entitled, with their families and non-resident visiting friends, to all lectures, receptions, and exhibitions, given by the Art Institute, with the exception of the Sunday concerts.
