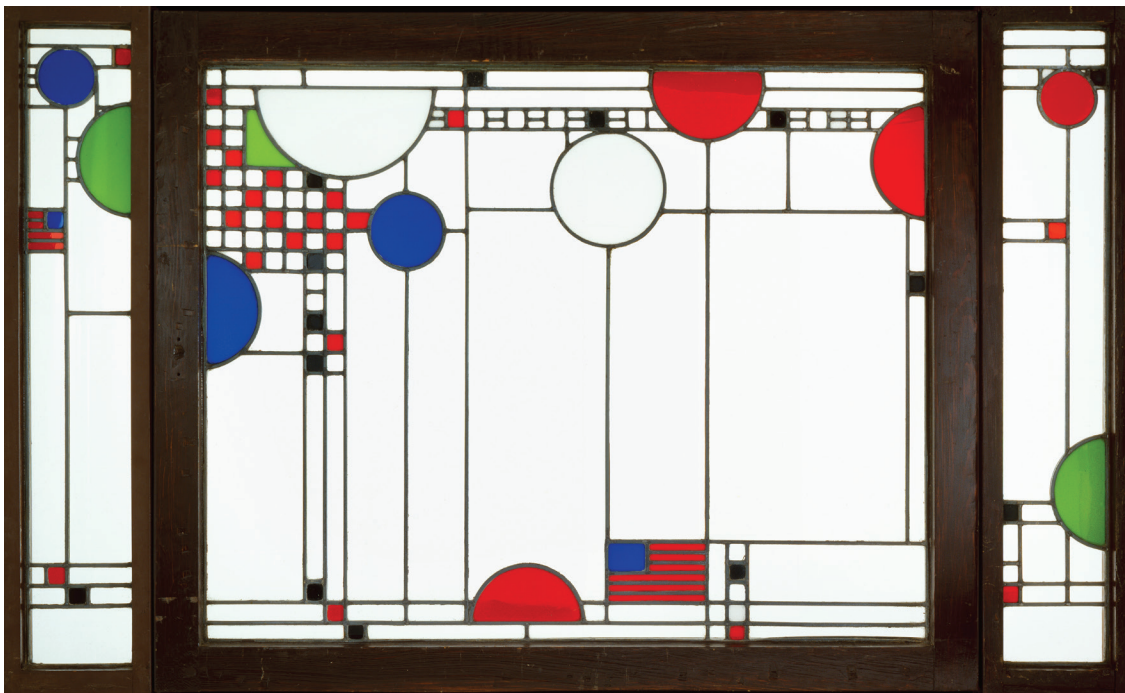


Art and Picture Books: Early Learning Activity
